

# These are the kids's graphic suggestions

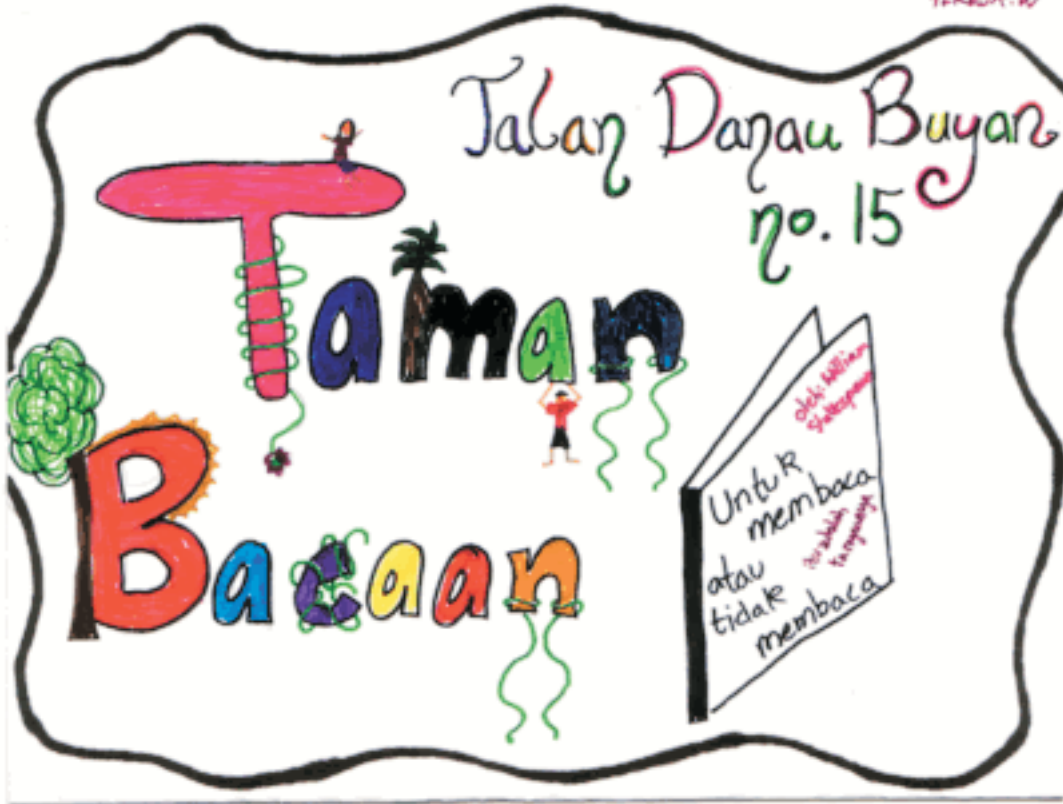


I like the style that the kids are drawn in anime is very popular with the kids here. This is the one that I like the best so far. I think the background could use some work.

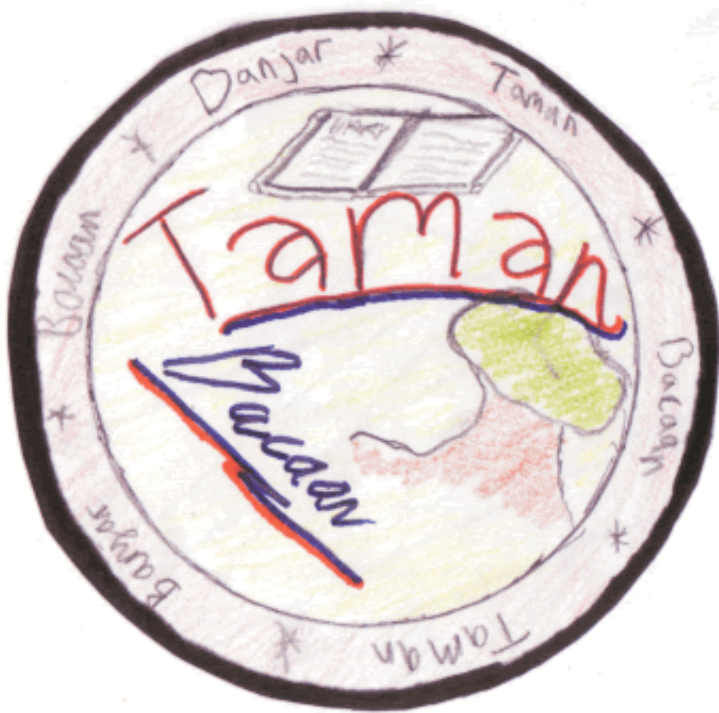


This one has the address which is Jalan Danau Buyan no 15.

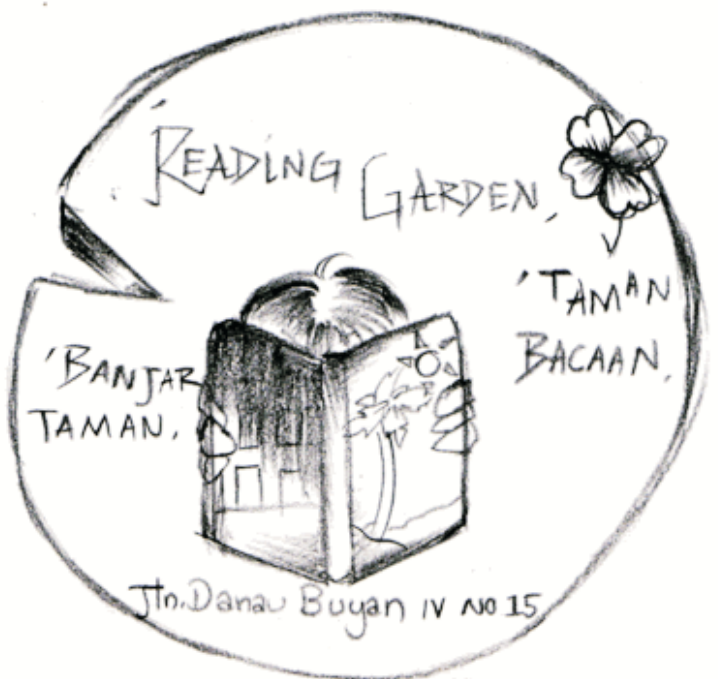

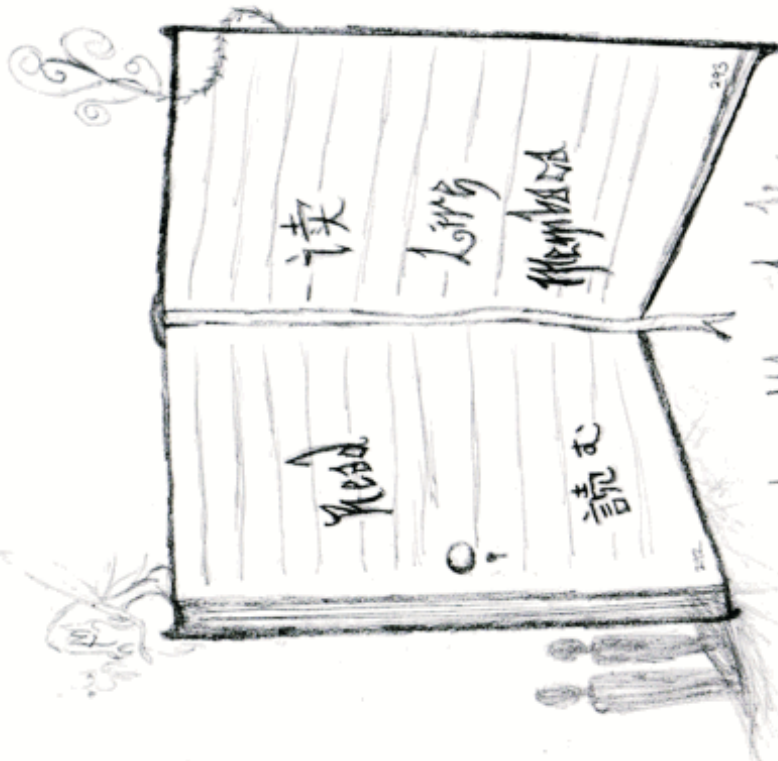
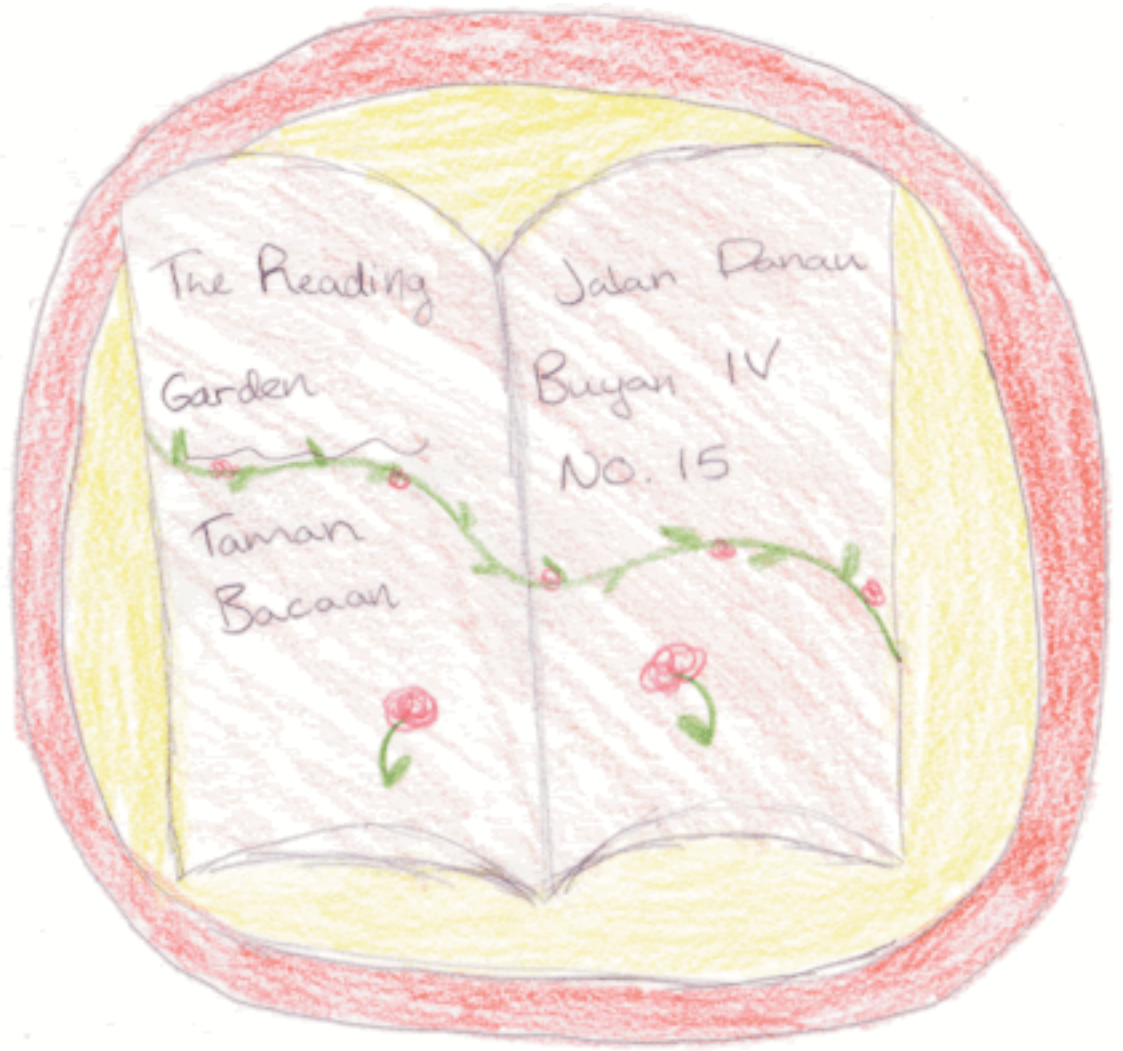
Not so sure about this one. Like how the words go around for some reason the kids think it should be a circle.

From the library, actually from any where in Bali you can see volcanoes. Might be an image to work with.



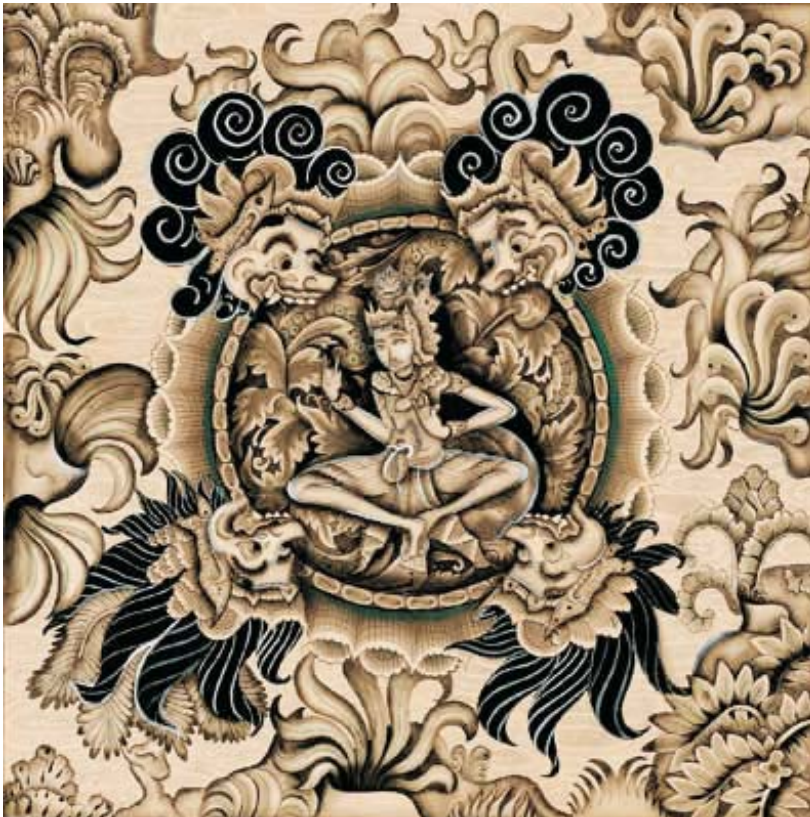
This is a local style of water colour painting the figures are monsters and sea gods. We're about 200 m from the beach.
